Immigration Cost Recovery Fees

The Department of Citizenship and immigration charges fees to partially recover the cost of providing certain services to the public. Since the processing fee helps defray the cost of processing your application it cannot be refunded even if your application is unsuccessful. The Right of Permanent Residence Fee (RPRF) for immigrants will be refunded for unsuccessful immigrant applications or for those who withdraw or otherwise abandon immigration to Canada before the visa has been used.

Fees must be paid by manager's cheque, certified cheque, postal money order or bank draft payable to the "Canadian Embassy, Manila". Cheques and PMOs should be valid for at least 6 months upon submission of your application. Please ensure that the proper bank authorities counter-sign any erasures or corrections. Overseas applicants must make payment at the Embassy, not in Canada.

Cash is not accepted and processing fees are non-refundable.

If the incorrect amount or an invalid payment method is used, your application will be returned to you without processing.
