## Visa for General Tourism

If you are going to Sweden on a sight-seeing tour, cruise, etc. you should apply for this visa.

- Original Application for Schengen Visa (Form 119031)
- Original Appendix D (Form 201031)
- Two (2) recent, coloured passport sized photos with white background not more than 6 months old. Photos should be **of good quality** and placed in a small plastic.  
  
Please do not staple, paste or clip the photos to the application.
- Original valid passport (should be valid at least six months after the expiration of the issued visa) and old passports. Passports with open lamination will not be accepted.
- Receipt in 3 copies of paid fee.  
(Please request for 3 copies from the bank).
- Confirmed roundtrip booking certificate (only printouts from the airlines or travel agency are accepted and should be at least 30 days prior to the departure date).
- Original marriage and/or birth certificates.
- Confirmation from the local travel agency's counterpart in Sweden, or foreign tour operator (your booking for a particular package tour, sightseeing or similar). **This must be sent directly to the Embassy by e-mail.**
- Confirmed hotel booking from Sweden. **This must be sent directly to the Embassy by e-mail.**
- Day-to-Day Tour itinerary (day 1 to day end).
- Original proof of sufficient funds to travel (bank certificates not more than one month old from the date of issuance with bank books).

### Facts

In order to read the forms you need to have Acrobat Reader installed on your computer. If you do not have the programme you may download it, free of charge, from [Adobe's website](#).

- If employed:
  - Original Employment Certificate (stating date of employment, salary, permanent or contractual)
  - Original Certificate of Vacation Leave (with or without pay, when are you being expected to report back to work). Certificates should be written using the official letterhead of the company and not more than one month old from the date of issuance.
  
- If self employed:
  - Business/documents, either originals or certified true copies by a lawyer.
